## Vocational competences:

- provide customers with professional consultation regarding the sale of goods;
- wrap goods in various manners, including gift-wrapping;
- prepare and process sales receipts for the goods sold;
- handle refund claims in accordance with current legislation;
- work with devices, machines, or other equipment in the retail store;
- professionally handle goods in the store;
- collect, receive, and inspect goods;
- check physical inventory against accounting records of goods in the retail store;
- have knowledge of the main assortment of groups of goods;
- operate cash registers and payment systems, accept cash and cash-free payments;
- keep an administrative agenda associated with working the cash register;
- carry out basic promotional and window dressing activities associated with the display and sale of goods.

#### 4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

Graduates are employed in the sale of goods. After acquiring the necessary practical experience in the field, they are prepared to run their own businesses in the given area.

Examples of possible job positions include: sales clerk, senior sales clerk, cashier.
